What is HIV ?

The human immunodeficiency virus (HIV) is a virus that attacks the immune system.
There is no cure for HIV but there is treatment.

Who can get HIV?

Anyone can get HIV, regardless of:

- Age
- Gender
- Race or ethnic origin
- Sexual orientation

How is HIV spread?

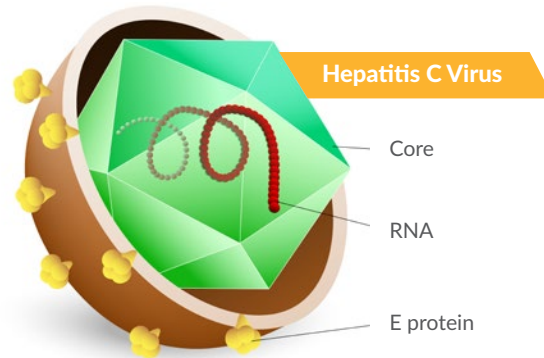
- Unprotected sex
- Semen
- Vaginal fluids
- Rectal fluids
- Blood
- Sharing tools to inject drugs
- To a fetus or baby during pregnancy, birth or breastfeeding



What is Hepatitis C (Hep C)?

Hepatitis C is a liver disease caused by the Hepatitis C virus.

The virus is common in Asian countries.



How is Hep C spread?

The Hepatitis C virus is spread when there is blood-to-blood contact with a person who has Hepatitis C.

This happens mostly through the unsafe reuse of:

- Syringes, scalpels and dental tools.
- Treatment equipment used, for example, in hemodialysis and other medical procedures.
